

Foreign Language and Area Studies (FLAS) Fellowship

2023 Summer Fellowship Application Submission Deadline: January 1, 2023

The Kimberly Green Latin American and Caribbean Center (LACC) at Florida International University is privileged to announce a call for applications for the Summer 2023 Foreign Language and Area Studies (FLAS) Fellowship.

Funded by the U.S. Department of Education and administered by the Kimberly Green Latin American and Caribbean Center (LACC) according to federal regulations, the FLAS fellowship supports language training in Less-Commonly-Taught Languages (LCTLs), including Portuguese, Haitian Creole, Quechua, and Quichua. The fellowship assists in the advancement of knowledge, resources, and trained personnel for foreign language and area/international studies and supports the development of a qualified pool of international experts with global competence designed to meet U.S. national needs.

The Summer FLAS fellowship covers tuition and fees (up to \$5,000) for Summer language training in the U.S. or abroad. Additionally, fellowship recipients are awarded a stipend (approximately \$2,500).

Full-time, degree-seeking FIU graduate and undergraduate students in any discipline may apply. Fellowships are available to qualified FIU and non-FIU students.Summer FLAS Fellowship recipients are required to enroll in a FLAS-approved **Portuguese**, **Haitian Creole**, **Quechua**, **or Quichua** language program. For a list of approved programs, please visit http://www.claspprograms.org/pages/detail/5/Language. Students must apply to an approved program prior to submitting a FLAS Fellowship application. Proof of program application submission will be required to certify FLAS funding eligibility. Students may wish to apply to more than one summer program, so as to increase odds of acceptance.

Undergraduate student applicants must be prepared to study one of the approved languages at the intermediate or advanced level. Undergraduate students at the beginning level of a language are not eligible. Graduate students may study one of the approved languages (Portuguese, Haitian Creole, or Quechua) at the beginning, intermediate, or advanced levels. However, graduate students applying to study a FLAS language at the beginning level must demonstrate they speak another language from the region, other than English, at the advanced level. Preference will be given to meritorious students at the intermediate or advanced level, as well as those in the professional schools (Business, Law, Medicine, Education, Journalism, Social Work, Engineering, Criminal Justice, Tourism and Hospitality, etc.), and those planning a career in U.S. government service are strongly encouraged to apply.
