In a heterogeneous country with a large history of social and economic exclusion as well as political divergences, the 2020 electoral process faces considerable obstacles. In 2019 the crisis of electoral legitimacy and subsequent postponement of elections, decreed by the Supreme Electoral Tribunal, exacerbated social and institutional conflicts. This situation is further complicated by the pandemic caused by the SARS-CoV-2 virus.
