LACC's Bolivia High Andes Qualitative Field Study for Community College (CC) and Minority-Serving (MS) Faculty is an international interdisciplinary seminar on the *Pueblos Originarios* (indigenous communities) of the High Andes in Bolivia. The 2021 Field Study includes a cohort of eight CC and MS faculty members from institutions in the Southeastern United States. Participants traveled to Bolivia to examine and interrogate more typical approaches to "Indigenous Studies" in the US and learn how to better support the comparative study of similarities, differences, challenges, and opportunities that cut across various native populations in the Americas. In this seminar, the participating LACC Bolivia High Andes faculty members will present final projects from the field study and how they will incorporate their experiences from Bolivia in their teaching and research.
