"Piano Lessons" is a feature-length documentary that explores the relationship between an artist and his mentor, and the value that this personal relationship can have in the process of artistic development.

The man and artist at the center of this story is Germán Diez Nieto, Cuban pianist and pedagogue, whose devotion to teaching has touched and formed many accomplished classical musicians and has created a community around shared artistic visions and values. The documentary will not only tell his untold and compelling story, but in doing so it aims to bear witness to the importance of Diez Nieto's legacy, a tradition of music making passing down directly from Franz Liszt.

Diez Nieto's story will be told through the voices of his students and family members, among them pianists, musicologists, conductors, composers, and educators.
