In this presentation, artist and art instructor Jhon Charles will examine different movements that have impacted Haitian painting and will provide a reflection on Haitian art inspiration, talent and creativity. His works have been displayed in Haiti, the Dominican Republic, Poland, Caracas, New York City, and Miami, among others.
