The Kimberly Green Latin American and Caribbean Center at Florida International University is pleased to invite you to a series of events during the Fall 2022 semester, which marks the launch of LACC's Program of Excellence in Brazilian Studies (PROBRAS).

PROBRAS is an FIU-wide effort and a key component of LACC's Emerging Preeminent Program status. In addition, PROBRAS is a fundamental component of the Center's objectives as one of the major actors in the field of regional studies in the United States. PROBRAS is pursuing a vision of growing research, education, and outreach activities related to Brazil at FIU.

Our vision for PROBRAS includes three main pillars that inform and sustain research, outreach, and teaching activities. These are built upon the experience and expertise of FIU departments, units, and faculty: a) Brazilian Culture, History and Language; b) Environmental Governance, Conservation and Sustainability; and c) Business. Our long-term goal includes positioning PROBRAS among the top 10 Brazilian studies programs in the U.S., with strong interdisciplinary research, policy connections, and teaching, rooted in established partnerships and collaborations with Brazilian and U.S. academic and research institutions, as well as governmental and civil society organizations.

The Fall 2022 series of events will begin on September 6 with a joint celebration of the Brazilian Bicentennial Independence, including special participation by the Ambassador André Odenbreit Carvalho, Consul General of Brazil in Miami, as well as other featured guests and speakers. This initial event will be followed by cultural events, interdisciplinary panels and other activities that will take place at FIU and community locations from September-December 2022.
