

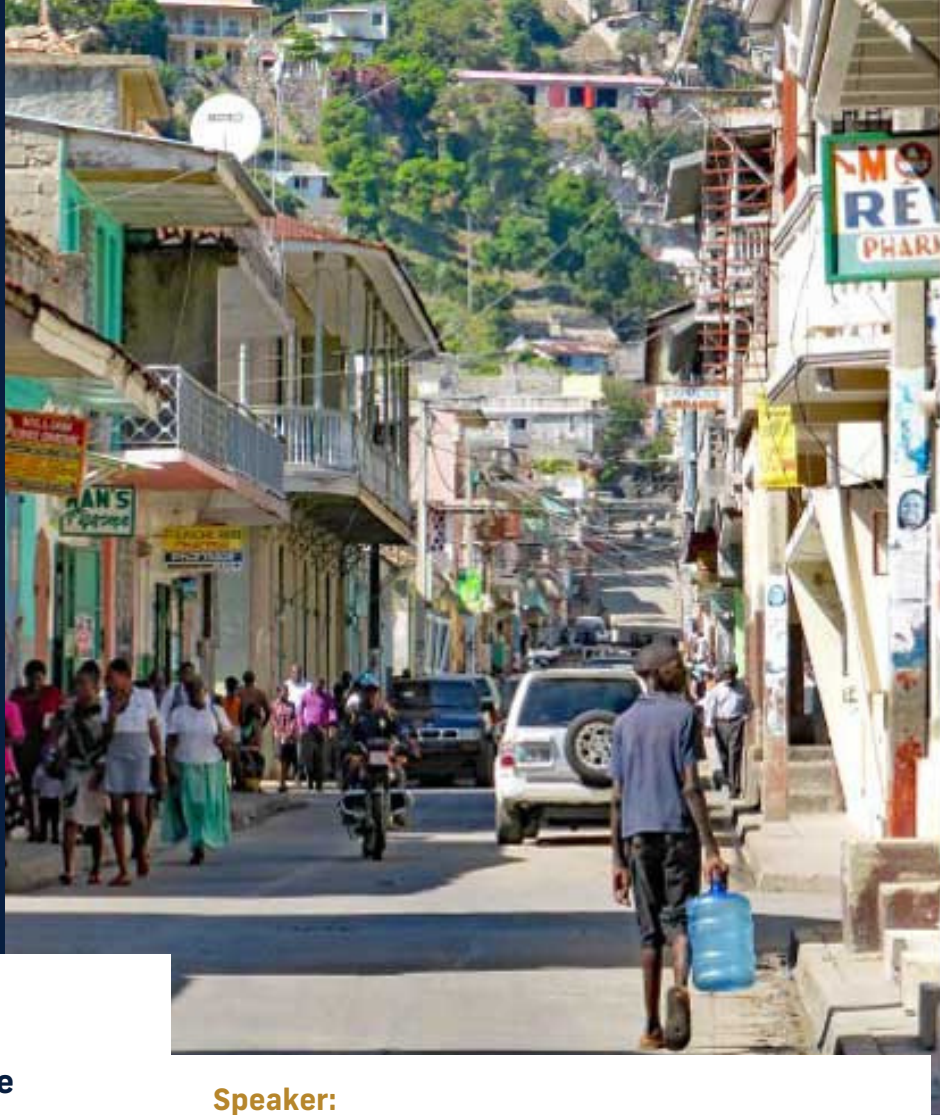
The Political Culture of Democracy in Haiti and in the Americas, 2021: Taking the Pulse of Democracy

Every two years, the LAPOP Lab at Vanderbilt University releases the AmericasBarometer, a regional public opinion survey that gauges the public's assessment of democratic governance and how citizens experience the rule of law. Haiti has been included as part of the AmericasBarometer since 2006, allowing for important cross-country and cross-time comparisons. In this presentation of the 2021 findings for Haiti, Dr. François Gélneau, Dr. Cristobal Dupouy, and Dr. Roody Reserve will discuss key findings as related to Haitians' democratic values, trust in institutions, and experiences in various dimensions of citizen security.
