

## **HSI Pathways Fellowship Application**

You are invited to apply for the Hispanic Serving Institutions- Pathways to the Professoriate program (HSI Pathways). The HSI Pathways program is a collaboration between eight partner institutions, aiming to prepare undergraduate students in the humanities and related fields to pursue a career in the professoriate through engaged mentorship and programming, opportunities to participate in research, a summer program focused on methodology in the humanities and social sciences, and a collaborative cross institutional conference focused on students' research. Undergraduate students in their third year are eligible to apply. Students must be majoring in one of the Mellon Foundation approved majors and should have demonstrated potential and desire to pursue a PhD with the intention of entering the professoriate. Currently, the Mellon Foundation does not have a policy that denies undocumented students from applying.

Students selected as HSI Pathways Fellows will receive various benefits, all of which are at nocost to students. Fellows will have the opportunity to develop deep knowledge and preparation for success in PhD programs, receive ongoing on-campus mentoring and programming addressing various dimensions of the process of applying to graduate school, access a virtual lodge to communicate with Fellows at the other two participating HSI campuses, gain exposure to professional skills, including an intensive summer research program that will focus on a rich exploration of research approaches drawn from humanistic methodologies and scientific inquiries focused on social domains. Fellows will also receive a summer and post-graduate stipend to help them successfully focus on research projects of their choosing.
