




Educational level in the four arrival groups

Year of arrival by education






Puerto Ricans in Florida are a skilled and educated group of workers.

Before emigrating, did you have family in Florida?


Most Puerto Ricans report having family in Florida before emigrating.


City of Residence in Florida










How long do you plan to stay in Florida?




Would you return to live in Puerto Rico?






How many members of your family accompanied you on your trip to Florida?






What is the likelihood that a family member will move to the US?


















Is the job you currently hold in the same area as the one you held in Puerto Rico?












On a scale of 1-5, how difficult has it been to find a job?









As % what year did you arrive in Florida











Are you most likely to vote for a Democratic or Republican candidate?



On a scale of 1-5, where 1 is Democrat and 5 is Republican, are you most likely to vote for a Democratic or Republican candidate?










