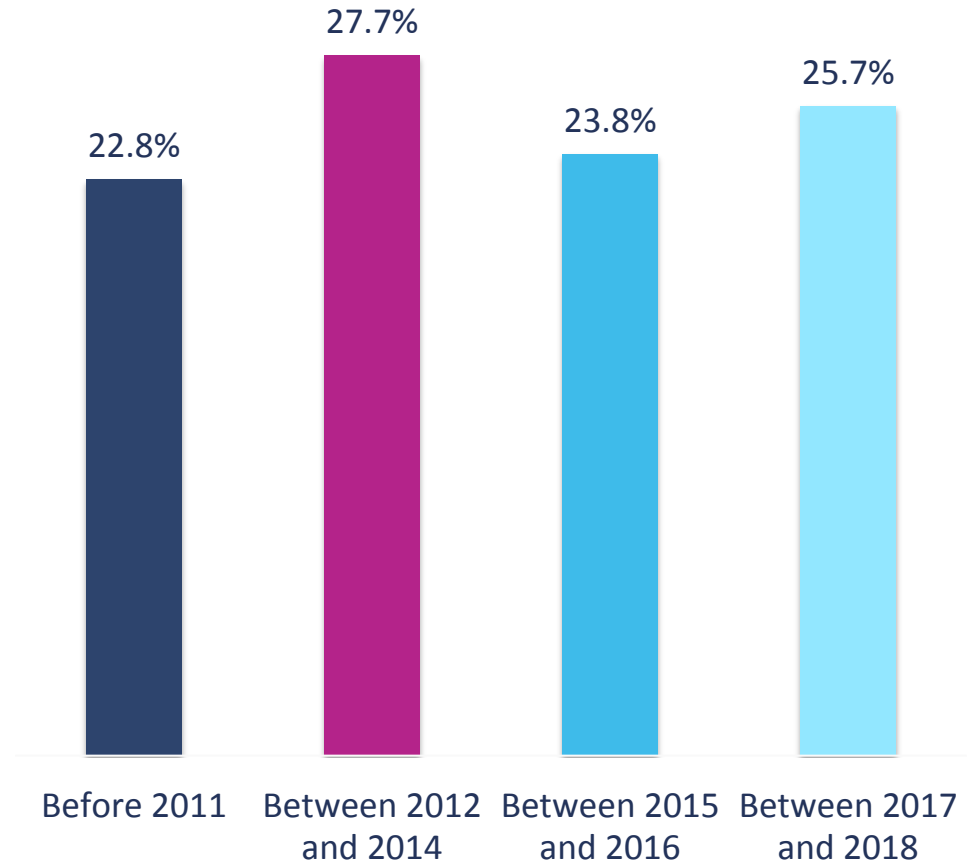

Year of arrival in Florida

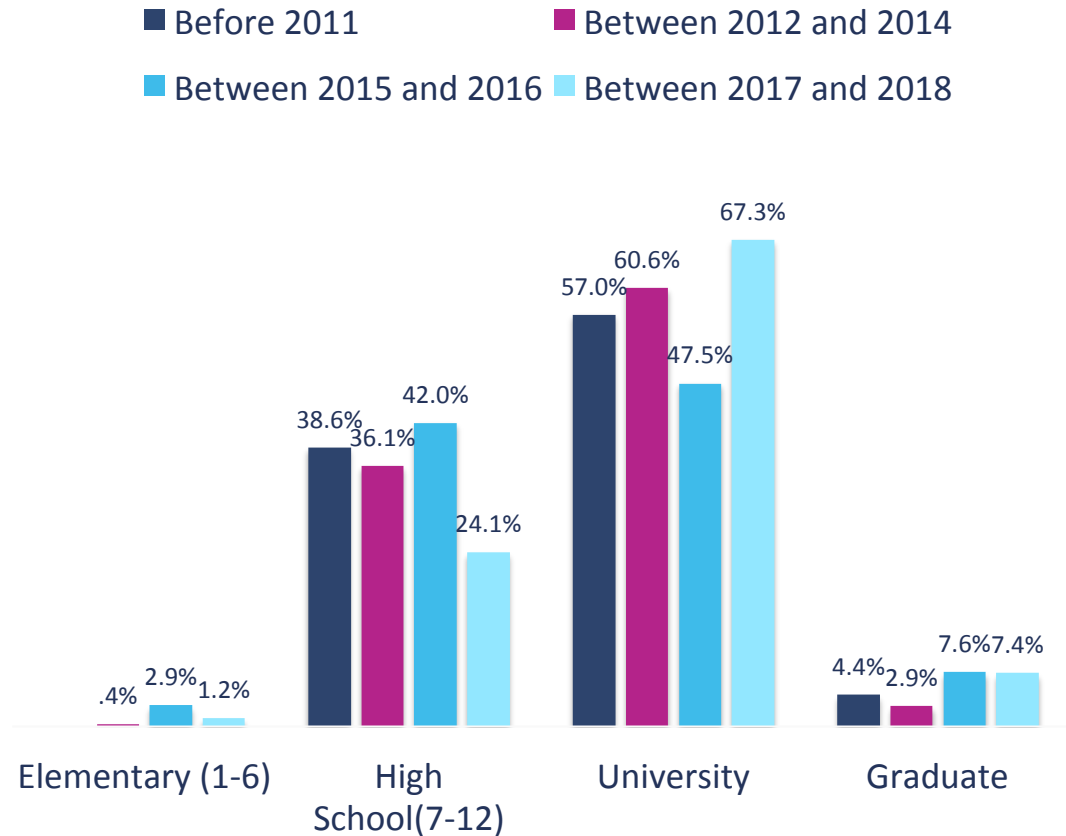
Sample of 1000 Puerto Ricans.

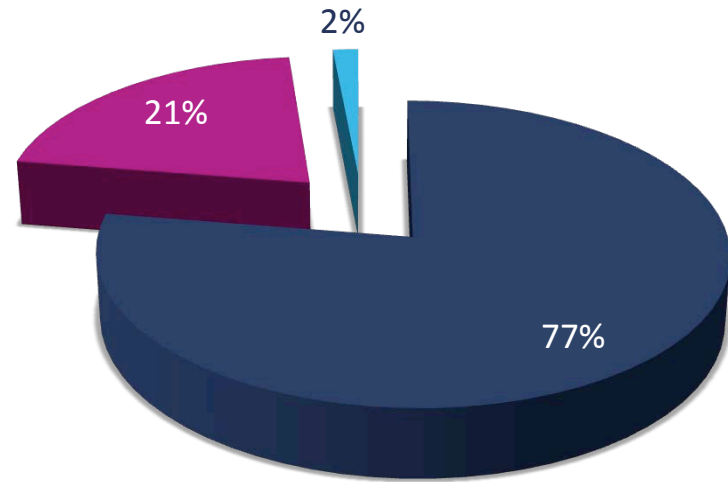
Before emigrating, did you have family in Florida?

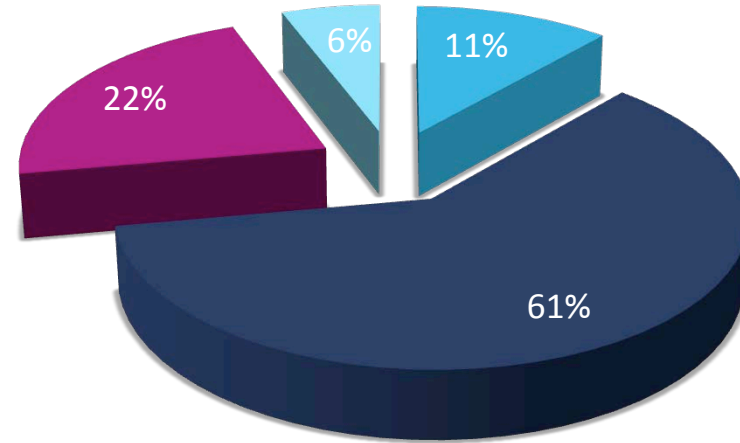
City of Residence in Florida

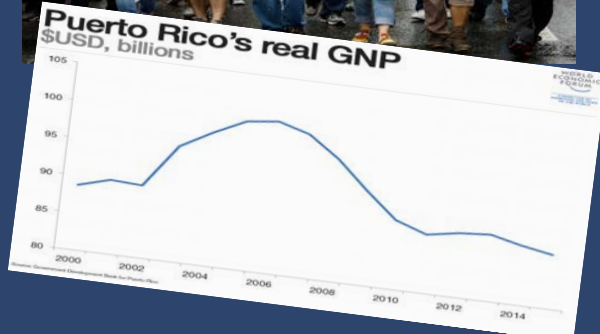


Prior to emigrating to Florida in what city/ town did you live?

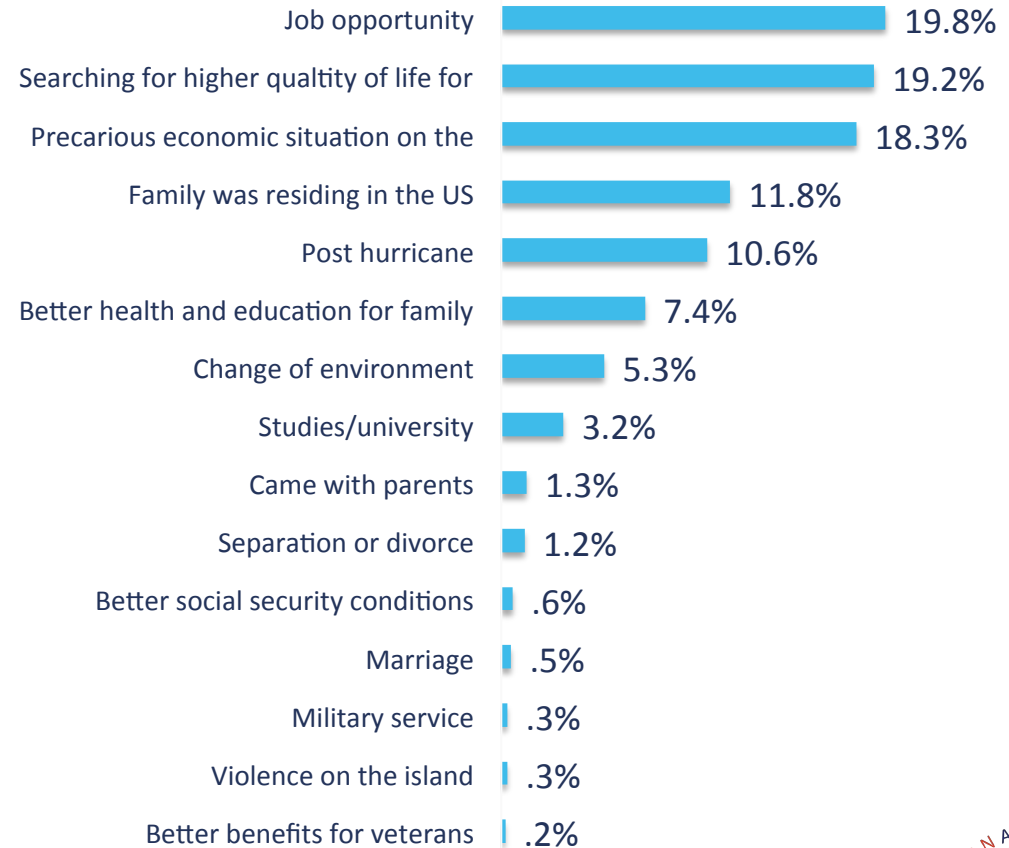
Puerto Ricans in Florida come from at least 70 different towns and cities although mainly from larger urban centers like San Juan.

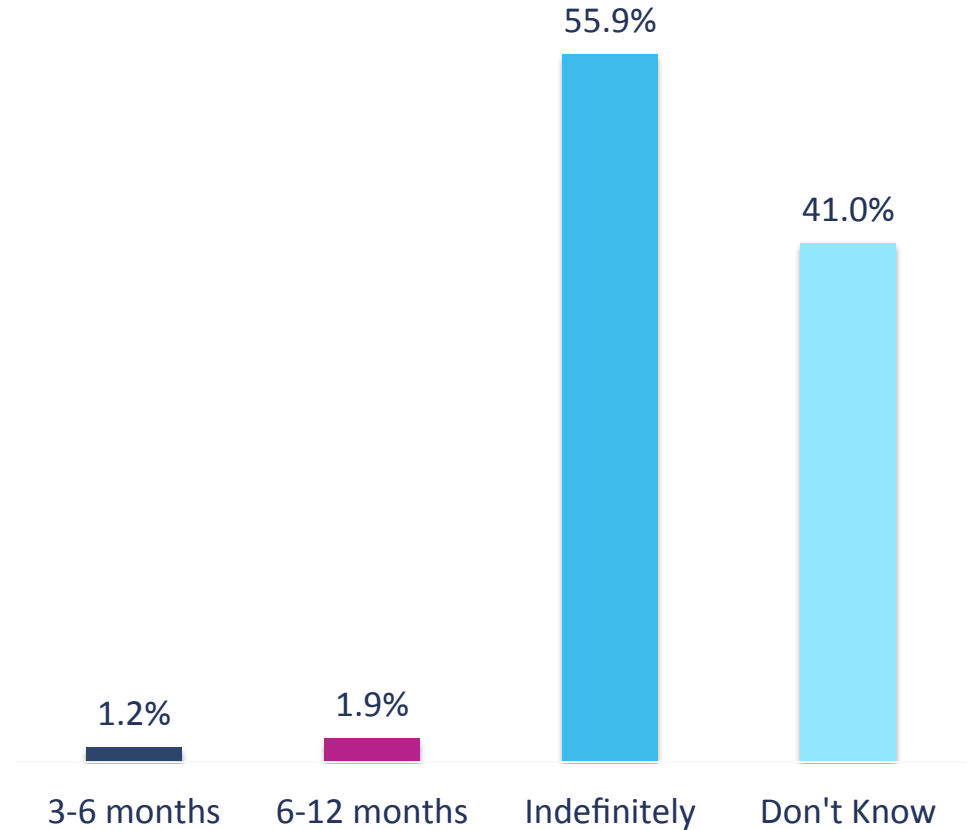

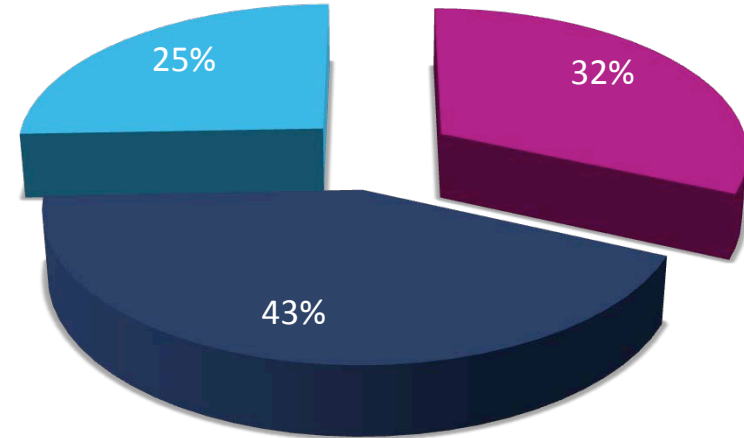


Would you return to live in Puerto Rico?

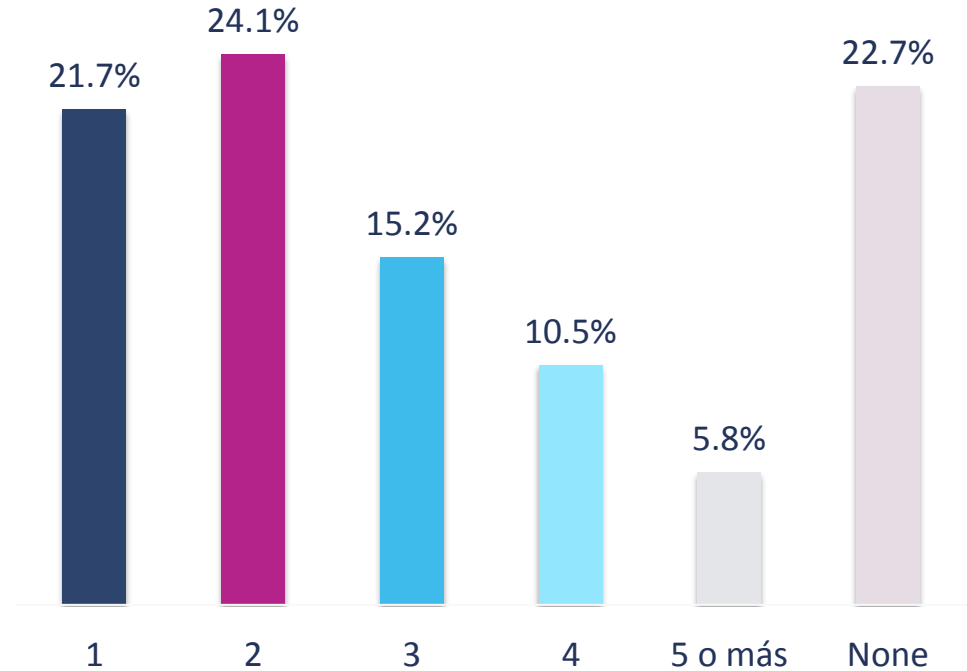

How many members of your family accompanied you on your trip to Florida?



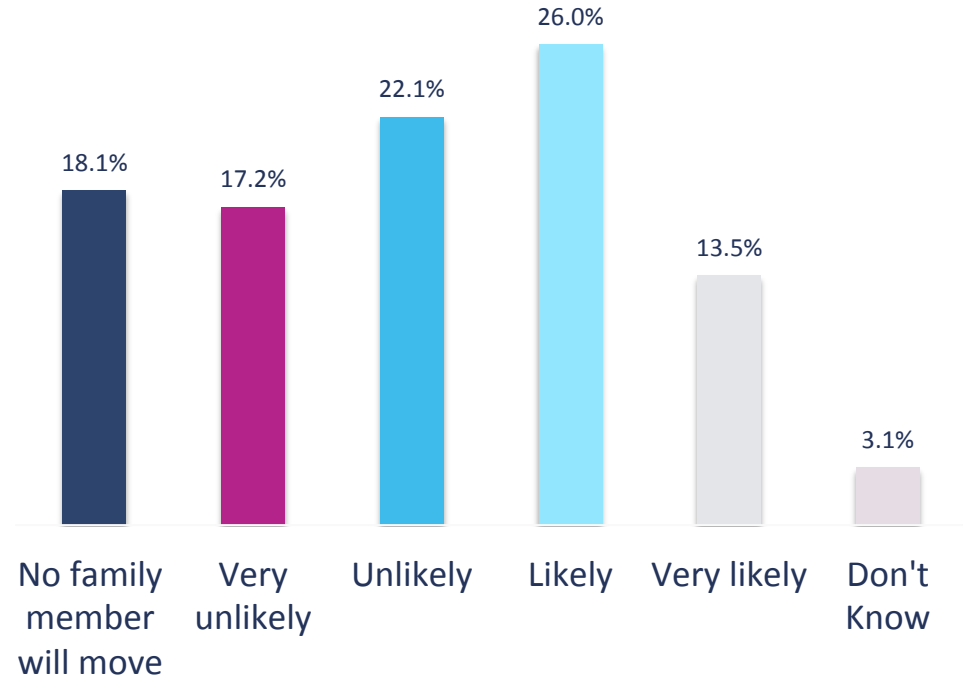

What is the likelihood that a family member will move to the US?



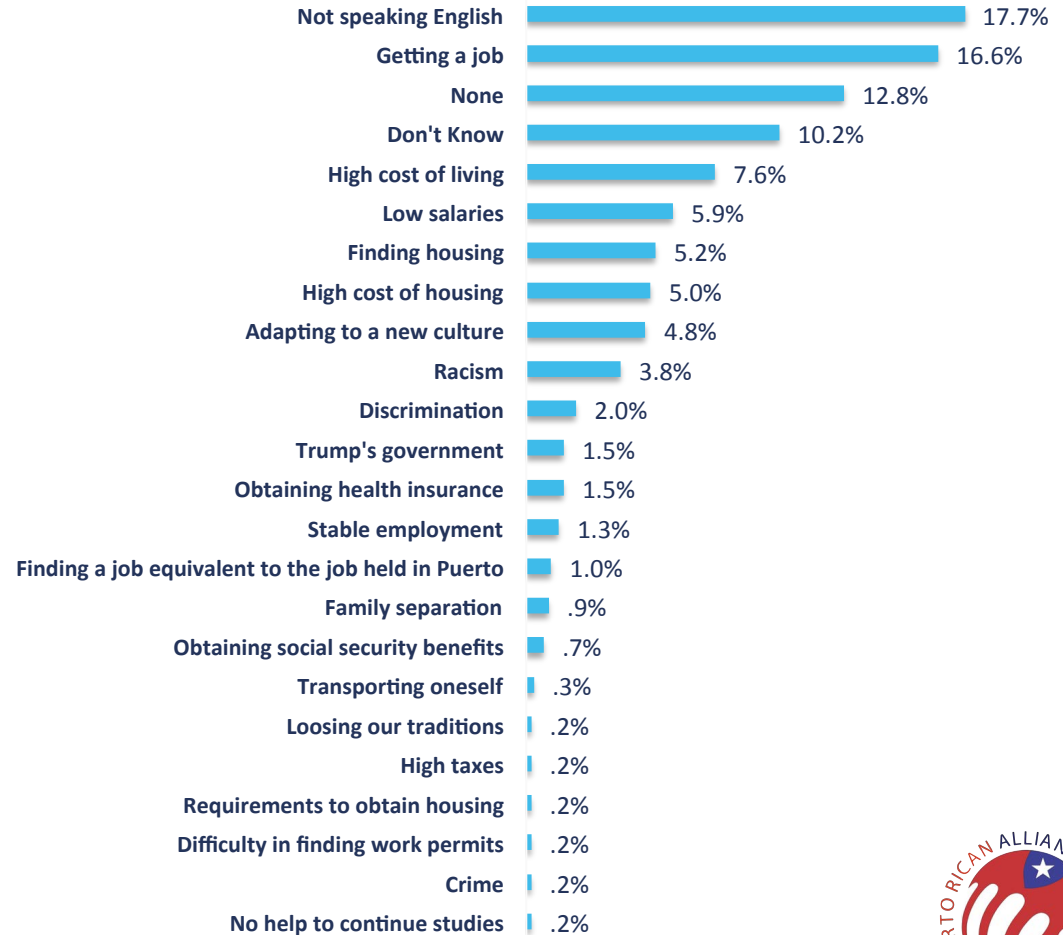

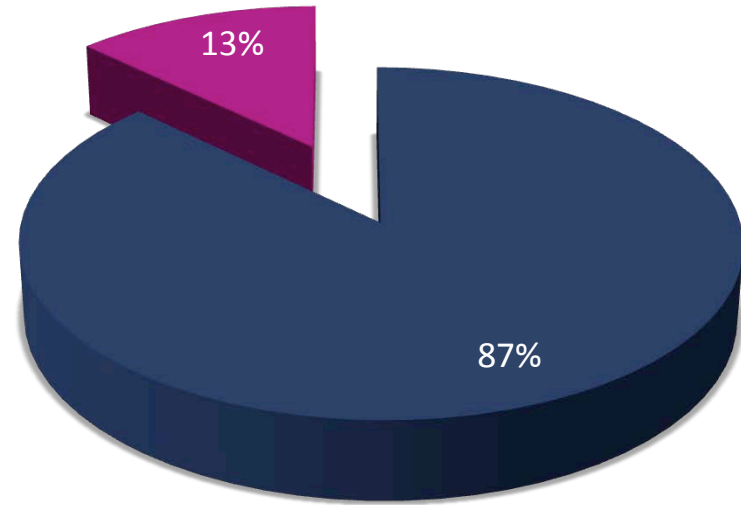

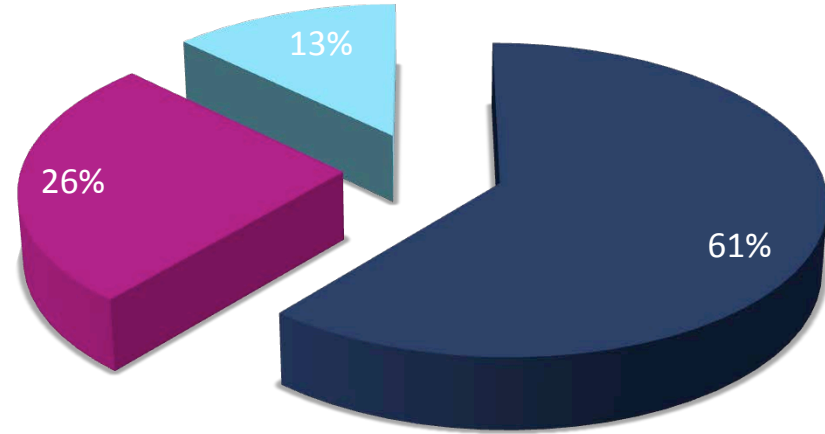

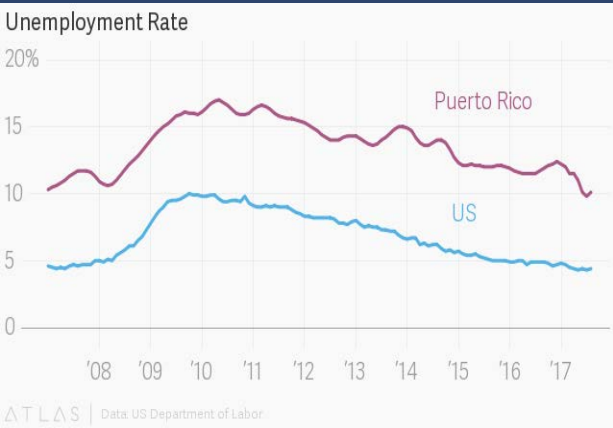

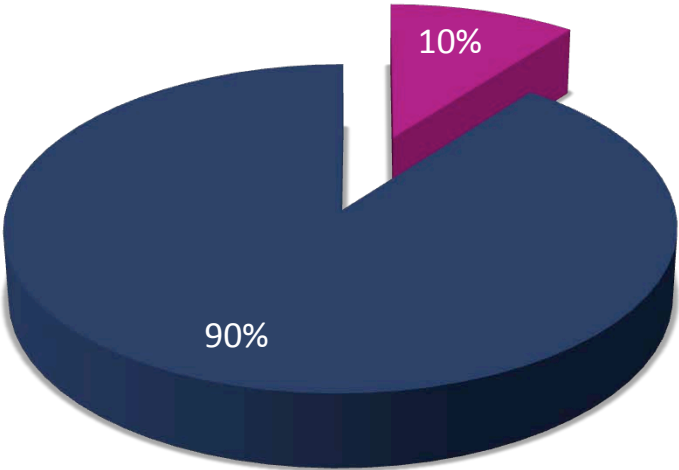

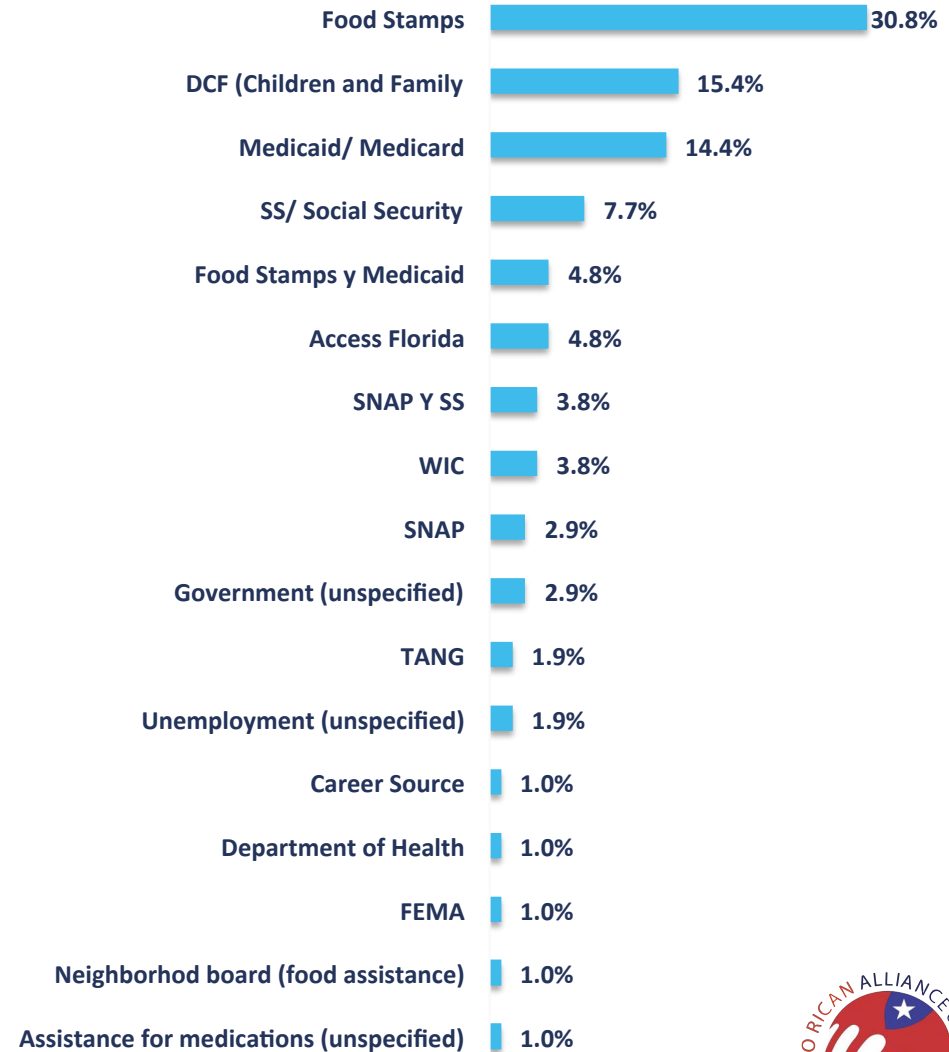

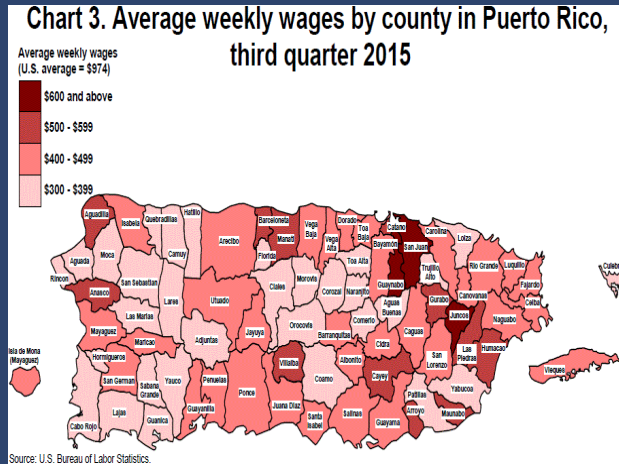

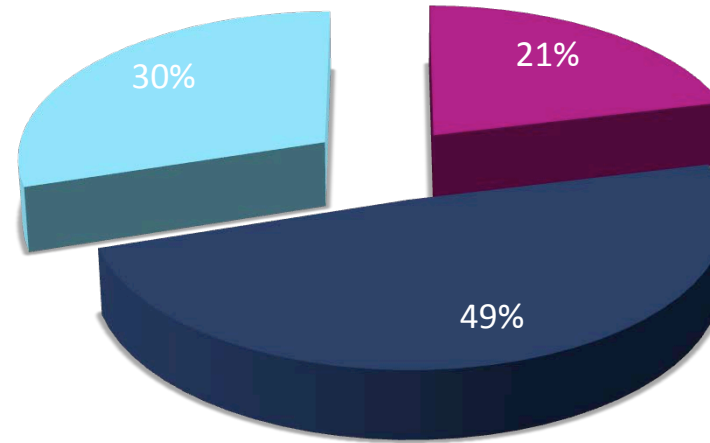
If you received aid/ assistance, from which agency?

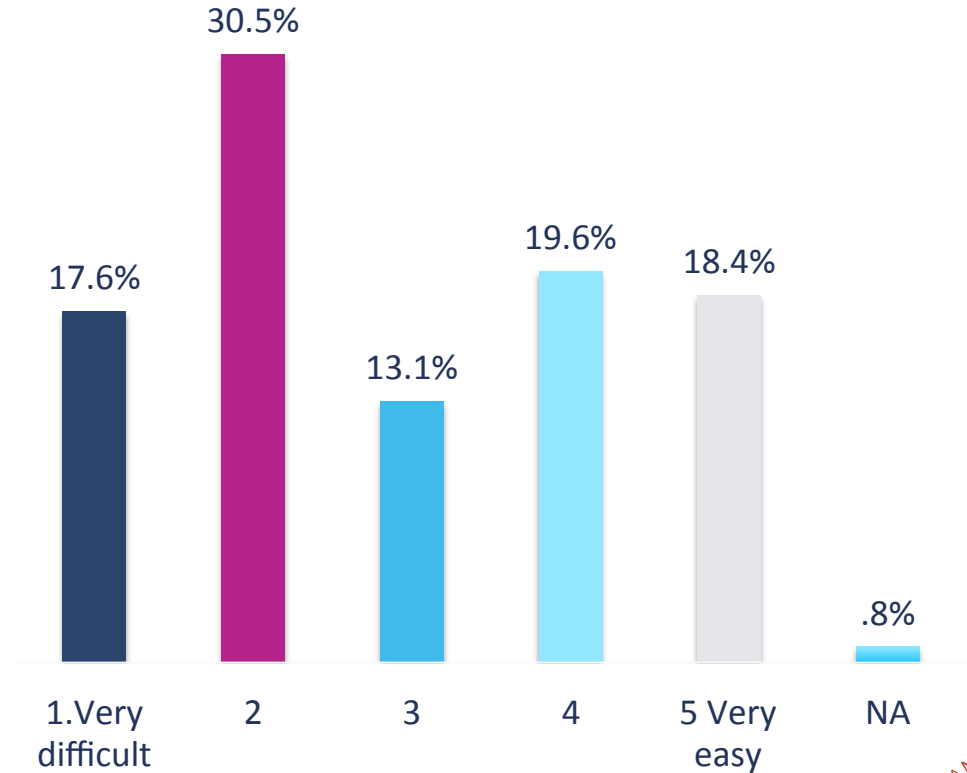


On a scale of 1-5, how difficult has it been to find a job?

Puerto Rican migration could impact Orlando jobs, economy



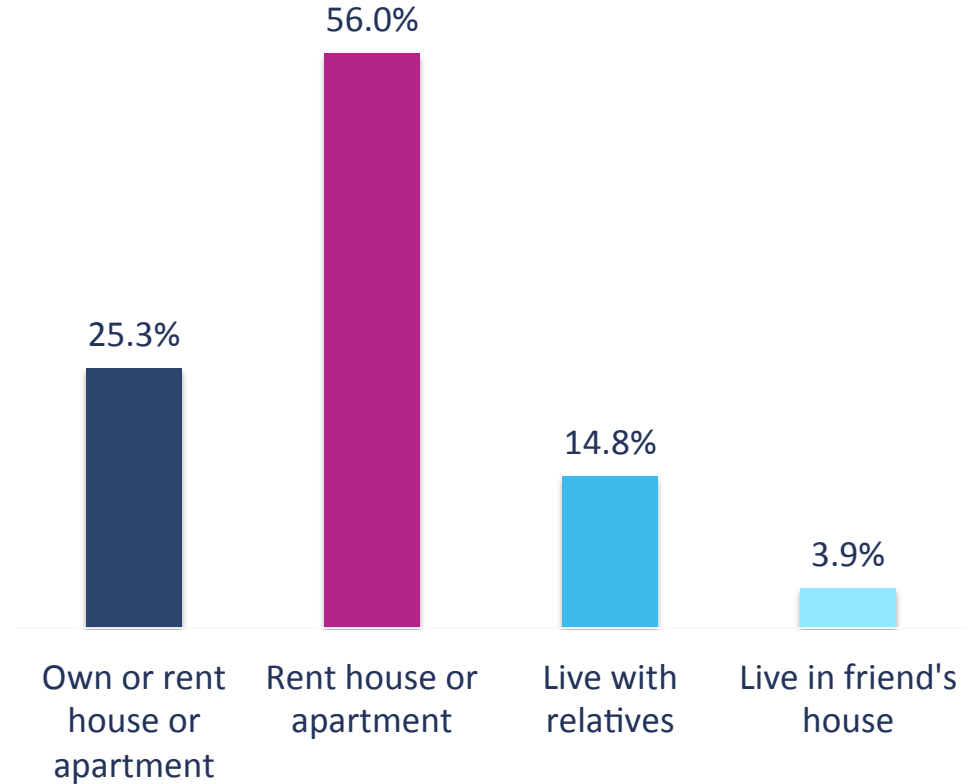

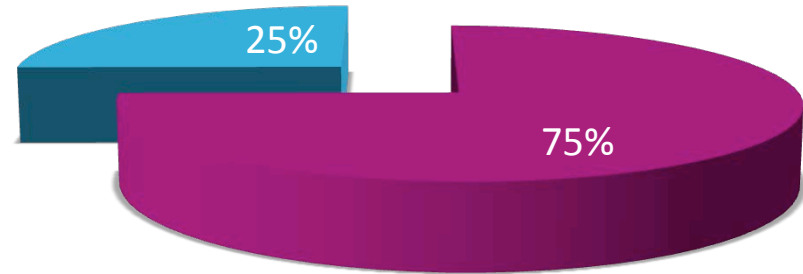

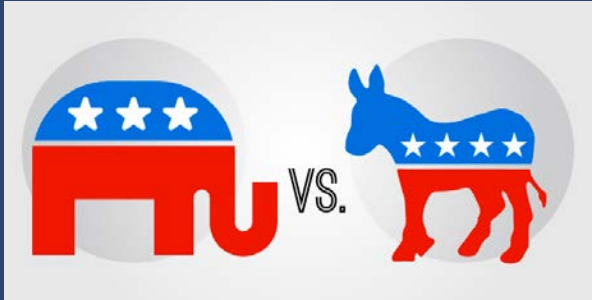

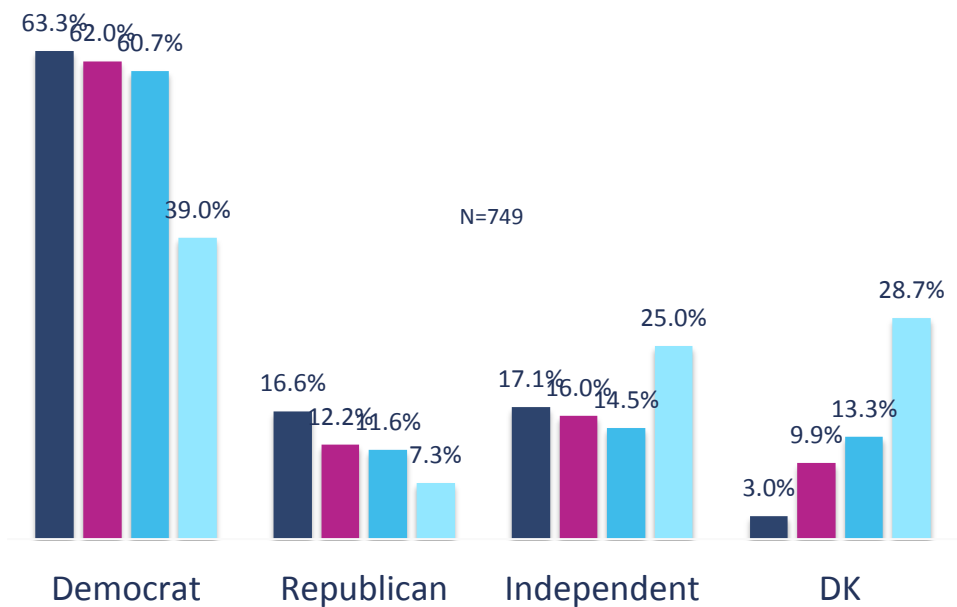

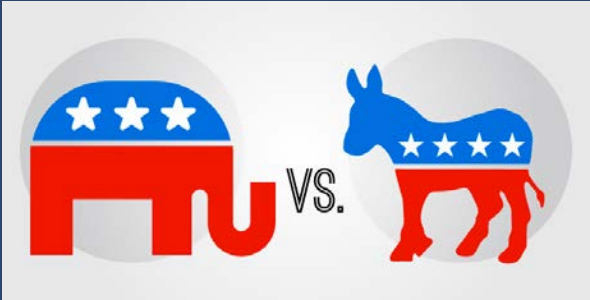

As % what year did you arrive in Florida

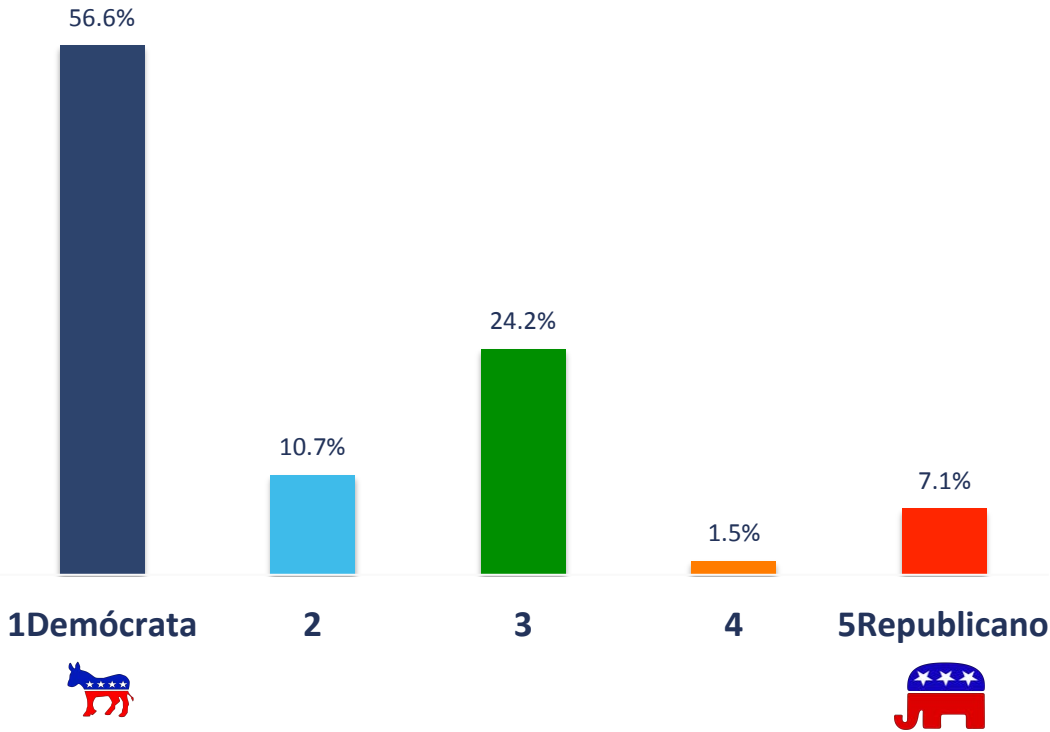

Are you most likely to vote for a Democratic or Republican candidate?



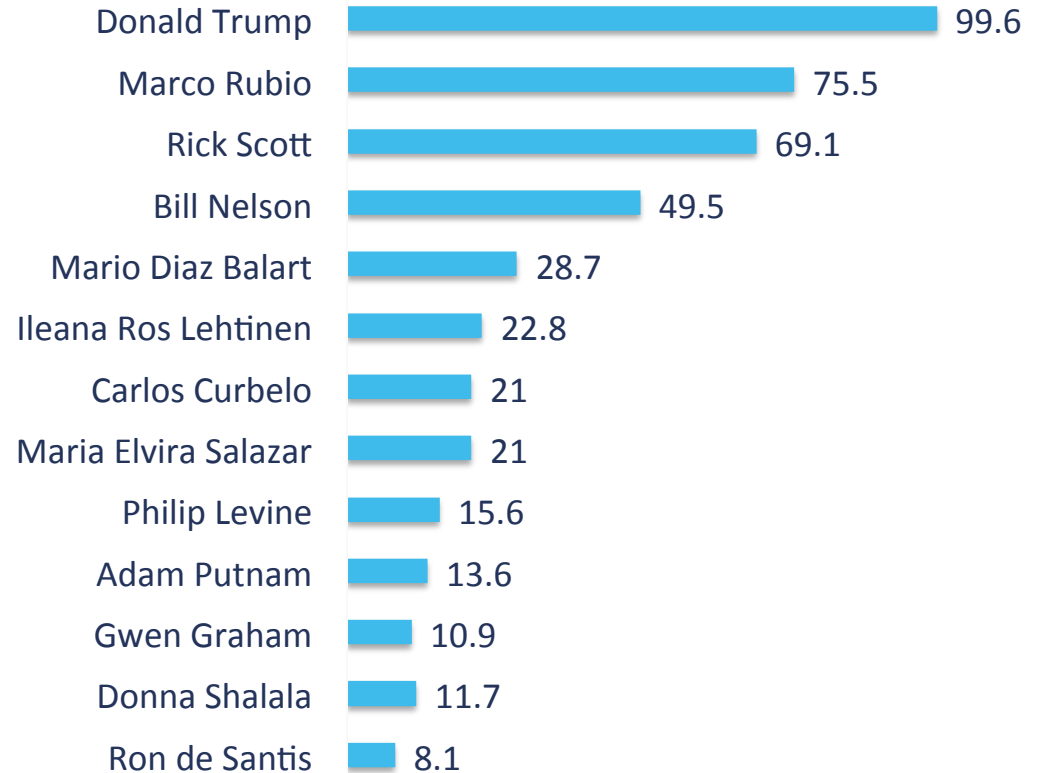

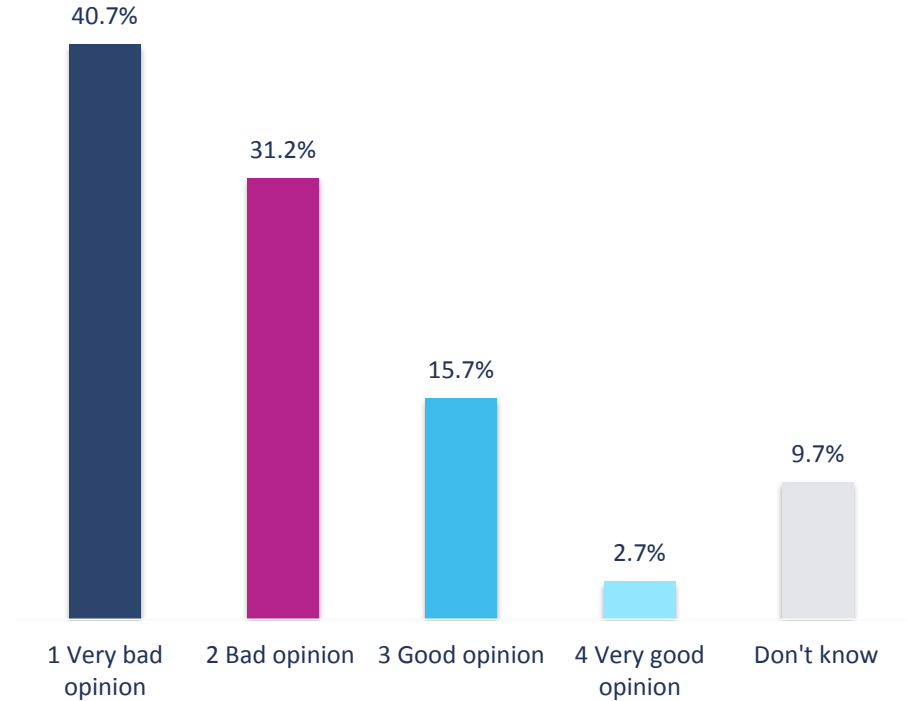

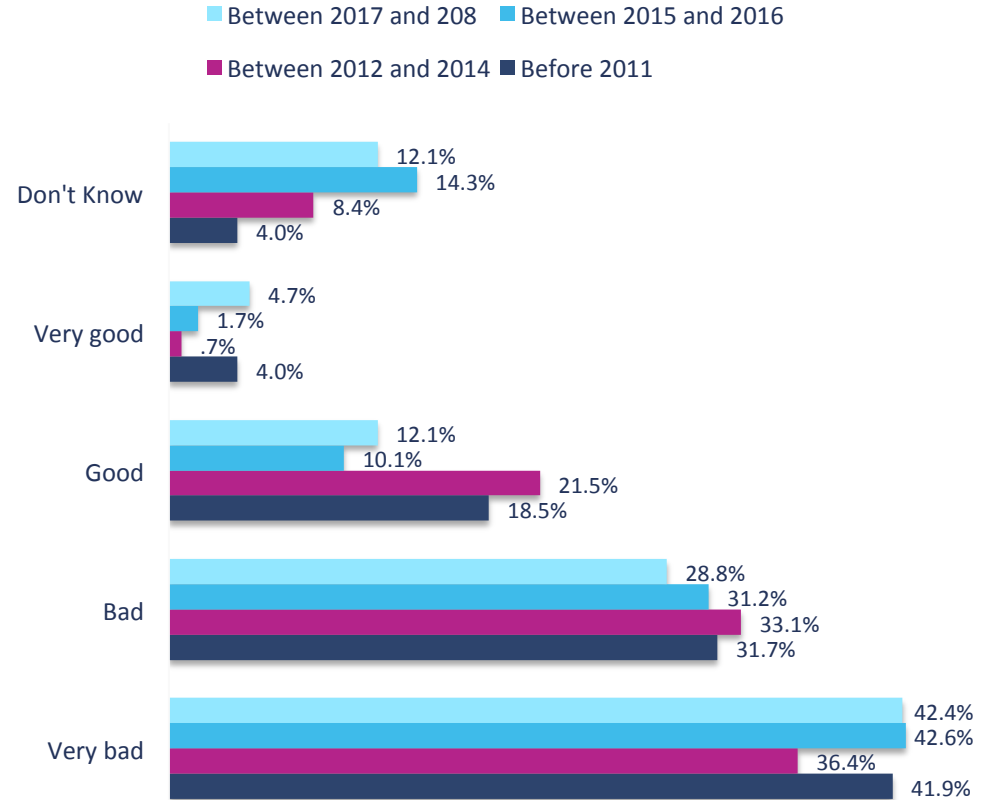

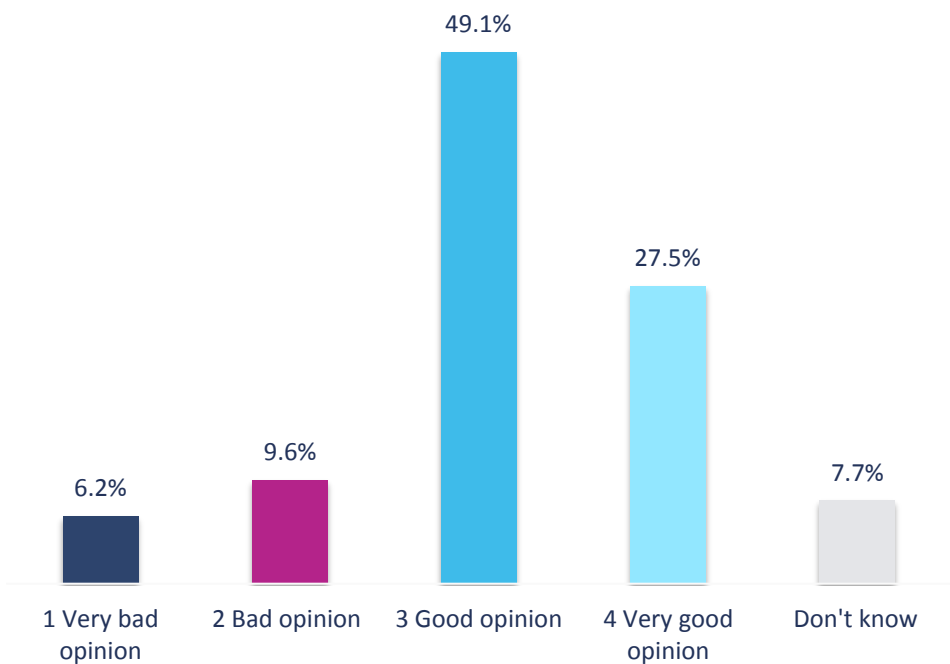

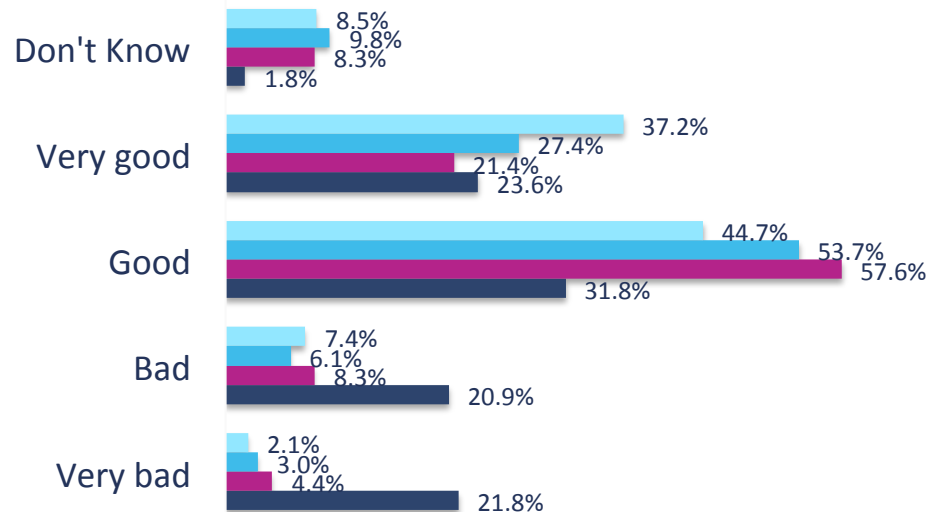

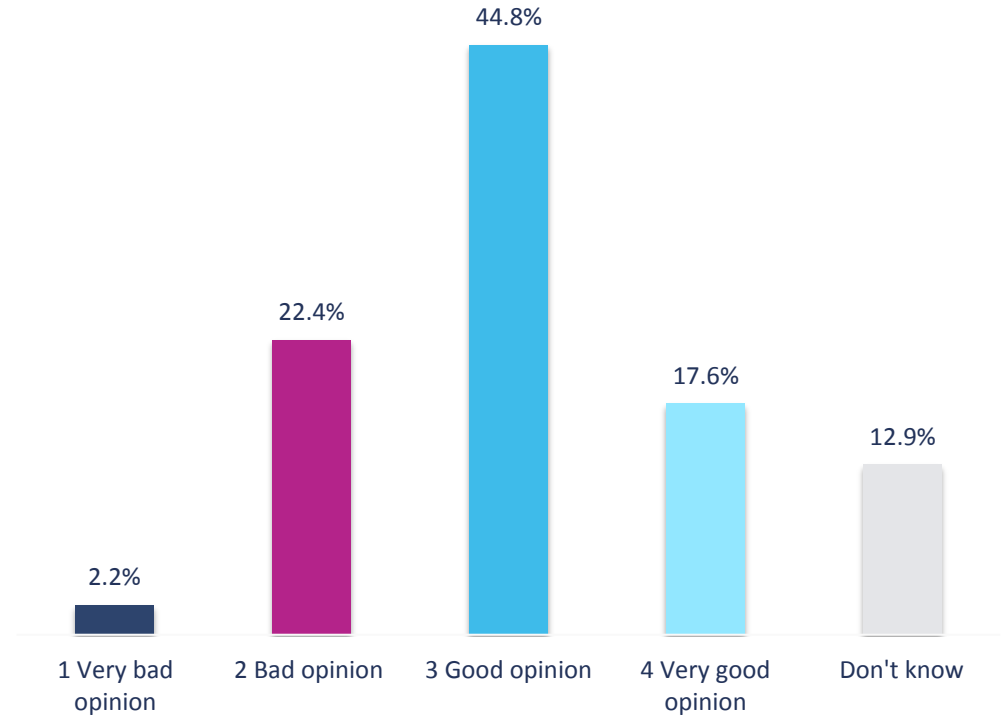

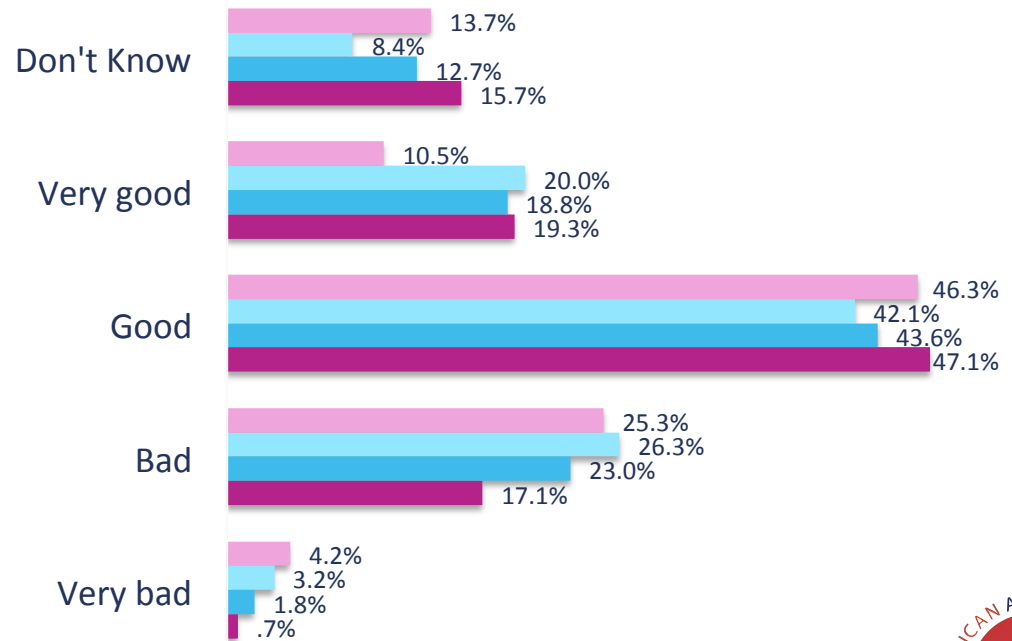

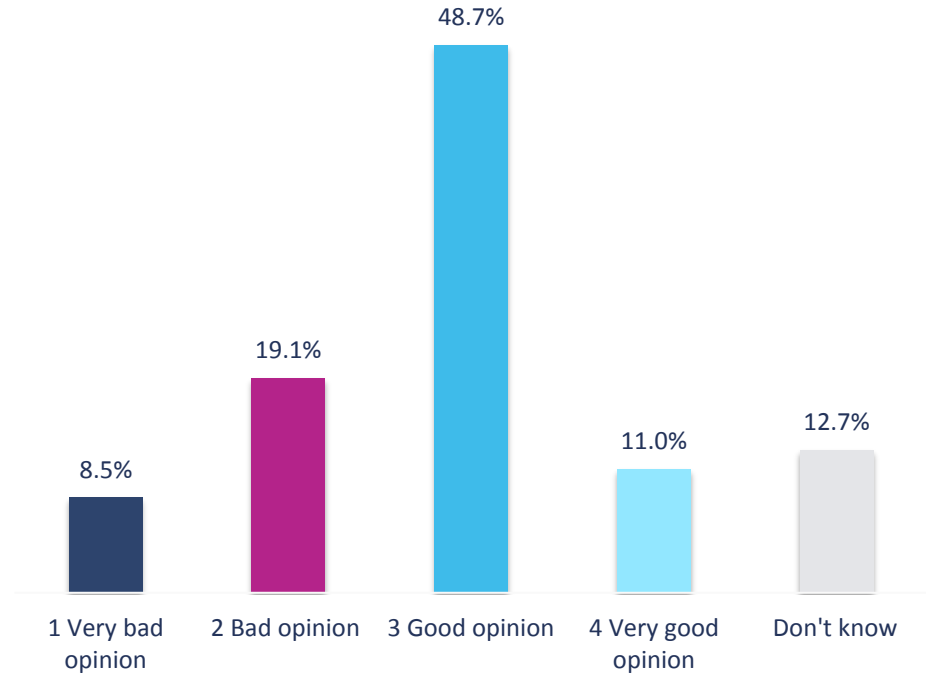
